ANDREW CALDER BALSILLIE AWARD

This award will be given out at our assembly on Friday 12th December to the selected Grade 4 student. The following details outline the award.

The Balsillie family have been associated with the school for well over 100 years. On 3rd April 1911, the staff and students marched from the old Olinda Street School to the new school here in Peel Street, led by 6-year-old Calder Balsillie playing the kettle drum. Calder's father Andrew was an active member of the School Council in the early years also. Calder's son John attended the school from 1933 to 1940. One of John's children also attended the school.

In 2007, John Balsillie established the Andrew Calder Balsillie Citizenship Award to be awarded each year to a student in Grade 4 for 'Active participation and making an outstanding contribution to the school community.'

FREE PUBLIC TRANSPORT

From 1 January 2026, people aged under 18 can travel free on all Victorian public transport services using a new youth myki card. This includes trams, trains, buses and coach services.

To access free travel, they must tap the myki card on and off each time they travel. For areas that do not use myki cards, they must show their myki card to travel free.

Wellbeing spotlight



At our school, you'll notice some clear and consistent routines: Silent entry to class, lining up in set places, and desks arranged in rows for whole-class learning. While we value collaboration, creativity, and group work, we also know from brain science that strong routines and predictability help students thrive.

When students know exactly what to expect, it reduces uncertainty and anxiety. This creates a calm, focused environment where their brains can concentrate on the learning rather than on what's going to happen next. Predictable routines also support self-regulation, respect, and a smoother start to each lesson.

For example:

- Silent entry helps students transition calmly from play to learning.
- Lining up in set places reduces jostling and distractions.
- Rows for whole-class instruction ensure clear sightlines and focus when introducing new concepts.

Of course, we balance this structure with plenty of opportunities for collaboration, discussion, and creative thinking. The routines give us the foundation; the variety in learning activities helps students apply and extend their skills.

It's a bit like music; strong rhythm and structure set the beat, but it's the melodies and harmonies that bring the song to life.



Social Media Age Restrictions

Navigating the social media changes

From 10 December 2025, certain social media platforms won't be allowed to let Australian children under 16 create or keep an account, giving them more time to develop important skills and maturity.

Quick facts:

- The age restrictions are likely to apply to Facebook, Instagram, Kick, Reddit, Snapchat, Threads, TikTok, X and YouTube, as well as other platforms.
- Under-16s will still be able to see publicly available social media content that doesn't require logging into an account.
- Most standalone gaming and messaging apps, as well as many services that support health and education, will not be affected by the new law.
- There are no penalties for under-16s who access an account on an age-restricted social media platform, or for their parents or carers. This is about making the platforms take greater responsibility for the safety of children – they face fines of up to \$49.5 million dollars if they don't take reasonable steps to implement the changes.

How to get ready for the social media age restrictions

- ✓ Start having open, ongoing conversations with under-16s about their social media use, how they feel about the new law and what they can do to get ready. You could use eSafety's conversation starters for parents and carers to help with these conversations.
- ✓ List the online platforms and apps children have accounts with, as well as the key people, groups, communities and services they connect with on each, to determine which accounts they are likely to lose.
- ✓ Help your child plan and organise other ways to stay in contact with their friends, such as offline activities, or online messaging and gaming apps that are not age-restricted. Get them to note important phone numbers, tags and account names.
- ✓ Together, search for age-appropriate sites, apps and offline activities that allow your child to follow their interests and build a sense of connection and community. This is especially important if they rely on social media for support services.




