CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND APPLICATIONS

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 54433 537 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page](#).

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

SUPERVISION RESPONSIBILITIES BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

At Quarry Hill Primary School, the school grounds are supervised by staff from 8.45am before school and until 3.45pm after school.

There may be staff in attendance at the school before and after those times, but those staff may be involved in tasks such as meetings or lesson preparation. This means that these staff members will not be supervising students.

A number of parents accompany their children to school and wait to see that they are settled. This practice is fine, and is certainly encouraged, as parents are supervising their own children.

Formal before and after school care is available within the school grounds and is operated by Camp Australia. Information regarding this program is available from the office, or can be accessed online at

Health and Wellbeing - SAFEMinds

SAFEMinds stands for Schools And Families Enhancing Minds and is an early intervention in mental health support for children and young people in schools.

Approximately 70% of young people who experience mental health difficulties do not receive mental health care; adolescent boys are particularly reluctant to seek help. It is important to encourage young people to seek help and it can be useful to remind young people that everyone needs help sometimes; that's normal.

NIP it in the bud! provides a whole school approach to recognising and responding to early warning signs of depression, anxiety and emotional distress. N – Notice, I – Inquire and P – Plan.

At school we are celebrating differences and uniqueness this week as well as building our understanding of ASD. People may mask autism for a variety of reason such as feeling safe and avoiding stigma. In her blog and on her podcast, Sue Larkey, discusses this really common coping mechanism used by those on the Autism Spectrum.

Masking and the Veneer of Coping - What it is and What to do



Sue says, “masking is when a person on the autism tries to fit in and suppress their autistic tendencies. It’s particularly common for girls on the spectrum but I see in boys too.

Listen to the podcast why I prefer the phrase 'Veneer of coping'

The heartbreaking thing I find is students often come home and meltdown / shutdown. The pressure just builds up.

In this podcast I discuss what parents, carers and teachers can do to help support their students. This is SO important to try and minimise burn out.”

Children had the opportunity to see how maths is applied to everyday life situations and explore Maths in a hands-on way.

The session was highly engaging and showed that Maths is everywhere and of course that Maths can be fun!



Room 1

Last Thursday the whole school participated in a Maths Incursion and each session involved students exploring different stations with varying maths concepts. Students had to use problem solving skills, persistence and teamwork at each station! Here are some comments from Room 1:

Jack J – I liked that we had multiple choices with the different activities and each one was fun! I really liked how we got to work in groups.

Learning Tasks

At our school we use ongoing reporting to provide you with current information about your child's learning throughout the school year. This means you do not have to wait for the two school reports at the end of each semester. Our ongoing assessment is reported to you in the format of Learning Tasks. These are accessible via Compass. Learning Tasks include an individual work sample of your child's learning, a personalised marking rubric based on the learning demonstrated in your child's task, and an overview of the curriculum based learning outcome/s for that task.

In Term 1 of 2022, we have completed three Learning Tasks. Some of these have already been uploaded to Compass, as indicated by the Compass message/s sent out throughout the term. Some will be uploaded by the end of this week, as the final Learning Task for Term 1.

Term 1 Learning Task Foci-

1. Social Emotional Learning (SEL)- *Creating Our Learning Environment*
2. Mathematics- *Number and Place Value Skills*
3. Literacy

We encourage you to access your child's learning tasks as they are uploaded. You are able to leave a comment on the task for your child's teacher to read. If your child is absent during the period of time a Learning Task is being completed, every effort will be made by the classroom teacher/s to catch your child up. In some cases, this is not possible. When a child is unable to catch up, teachers will provide a comment to you based on how your child is progressing based on their classroom program. Learning Tasks account for a large portion of the annual reporting of your child's learning. The ongoing reporting of Learning Tasks is complementary to the end of semester formal reports you will also receive.

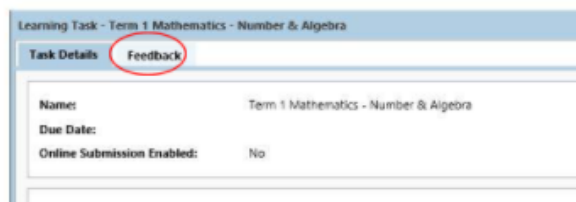
How to View Your Child's Learning Tasks on Compass

From Quarry Hill Primary School Compass website

1. Log in to Compass and go to your child's home page.
2. Select the pencil tab at the top of your child's home page and then choose learning tasks.



3. Select the learning task you wish to view.
4. Under 'Task Details' you will be able to view the task overview.
5. Select the 'Feedback' tab to view or download student work, marks and comments (if applicable to the task)



6. After viewing your child's learning task, you may wish to leave a comment in the conversation section.

1. When you open the app click on your child's photo.
2. Select 'Tasks'
3. Select the Learning Task you wish to view
4. Select the feedback tab
5. Open the PDF file to view your child's work.
6. After viewing your child's learning task, you may wish to leave a comment in the conversation section.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
