DROP OFF AND COLLECTION ALONG PEEL STREET

It has come to our attention that the designated accessible carpark zones are being used by others during the more congested drop off and pick up times. We have a number of families in our school who require easy access to these parks. Only cars that have an Accessible Parking Permit clearly displayed on their windscreen are to use these parks please. An Accessible Parking Permit:

- Can only be displayed when the vehicle's transporting the individual who the permit was issued to
- Must be clearly displayed so that the permit number and expiry date are visible from outside the vehicle.

Parents and carers waiting to turn into the time bound car parks along Peel Street are also reminded that it is illegal to remain stationary on the school crossing.

The City of Greater Bendigo randomly checks school zones and have been known to issue fines. We thank you for your help with this.


WORLDS GREATEST SHAVE

If you think that your child doesn't have as many friends as a sibling or other children their own age, don't be too alarmed. On average, children usually have only two or three significant friendships at any one time. It's the quality rather than the quantity of friendships that counts. If you are concerned that your child lacks friends at school encourage him to take up a variety of extra-curricular activities. It's easier to strike up a friendship with someone when you have something in common.

Above all else encourage your child to be friendly by talking to others, showing an interest in what other children do, offering help when needed and being willing to enter a new game or social situation. Consider teaching your child, if necessary, alternatives to fighting and arguing when there is disagreement and conflict within groups.

Re: Proposed Blackspot Safety Upgrade

The construction of a Pedestrian Safety Upgrade on Russell Street is proposed to commence in the near future. The works will be located between Olinda Street and Houston Street and will be funded under the Blackspot scheme.

This project will include minor Kerb and Path realignments, installation of a series of Splitter Islands, re-arrangement of the School Crossing with changes to traffic flow at the Malcolm Street intersection, and (maintenance) resealing of the road with associated linemarking.

Works will be conducted by COGB staff and contractors and are scheduled to commence on Monday 18 March and be completed in May 2023.

Due to the nature of this project there will be some unavoidable inconvenience regarding traffic and pedestrian access. We will endeavour to maintain access to your property at all times, but you may be required to follow any traffic diversions that are put in place to allow us to complete this work.




